**Hunters Point Naval Shipyard Parcel A-1, Radiation Health and Safety Scanning
Survey: Progress Update #11**

For the week of October 1, the CDPH Radiological Health Branch continues on the walkover survey scanning the construction “laid-down” area, bounded by Kirkwood Avenue, Jerrold Avenues, and Friddell Street. Two anomalies were detected and both were determined to be potassium-40, a naturally occurring substance. As stated in previous updates, detection of a naturally occurring substance above background is not unusual for a neighborhood scan and does not pose a hazard to people or the environment. In total, approximately 95% of the walkover survey area has been scanned. Additionally, the data analysis of the Towed Array RS 700 data sets continues.
