Hunters Point Naval Shipyard Parcel A-1, Radiation Health and Safety Scanning Survey: Progress Update #12

For the week of October 8, the CDPH Radiological Health Branch continued the walkover survey scanning of the construction area, bounded by Kirkwood Avenue, Jerrold Avenues, and Friddell Street. No anomaly was detected during this week's scan. In total, approximately 97% of the walkover survey area has been scanned. The developer is relocating construction materials to enable completion of the scan of this last remaining area.

Additionally, staff completed the data analysis from the Towed Array RS 700 that was used to scan streets, paved areas, or other outdoor flat surfaces. In total, the Towed Array RS 700 detected 49 anomalies, and all 49 were found to be potassium-40, a naturally occurring substance that does not pose a hazard to people or the environment.

The fieldwork for Parcel A-1 is nearly complete and our staff will now focus on preparing the final survey report for completion in late fall. CDPH staff are also preparing to begin scanning Parcel A-2, an open undeveloped area west of Parcel A-1.

Similar to the A-1 scan, CDPH has prepared a work plan for the A-2 scan as well as a summary document and a FAQ.
