Guidance for Termination or Decommissioning for Licensees Using Only Radioactive Materials in Sealed Sources

This guide is recommended for the purposes of terminating a Radioactive Materials License (RML), removing a use location or an area of use from a RML where the history of Radioactive Materials use only involved sealed sources. Ensure the following information is provided with the termination or decommissioning request letter:

1. Submit either:

- A certifying statement from the RSO that the licensee never possessed or used any sealed sources that leaked or were damaged in accidents or other unusual incidents; or
- b. If a leaking or damaged sealed source was possessed at the use location, submit a description of the sealed source, and the methods used to clean and dispose of contamination from the sealed source along with any associated survey results.
- 2. Provide an inventory list, including manufacturer, model number and serial number, of all sealed sources (including installed in a device) used or possessed since the most recent inspection or past 3 years, whichever is greater. Include a copy of the most current leak test report for each source.

If you wish to terminate the RML, the following additional information must be supplied:

- Submit form CDPH 5314 (08/17) titled, "<u>Certificate of Disposition of Materials</u>", available at: https://www.cdph.ca.gov/CDPH%20Document%20Library/ControlledForms/cdph5314.pdf. The form must be signed by the current RSO or a member of upper management (CEO, Pres, etc.).
- 4. Account for all the sealed sources on the RML. Provide a signed receipt or disposal manifest from the authorized recipient indicating that they received the sealed sources or devices and a copy of their RML if not a California licensee. If the recipient is a California licensee, please provide their license number. Ensure the letter contains serial numbers of device or sealed sources if not installed in a device.
