SUBJECT: 100+ NEW FORMULA OPTIONS ADDED TO THE CALIFORNIA WIC

AUTHORIZED PRODUCT LIST (APL)

Purpose The California Department of Public Health, Women, Infants and Children

> Division (CDPH/WIC) is reminding all authorized vendors that the APL continues to be expanded to temporarily include additional types and container sizes of infant formula options for CDPH/WIC participants. The APL is an electronic file of

all foods authorized to be purchased using the California WIC Card.

Background On February 13, 2022, Abbott announced that it is voluntarily recalling infant

formula produced at its Sturgis, Michigan facility. This recall continues to affect the availability of some formulas issued and redeemed by WIC participants in California. For additional information, please visit Abbott's Recall Information Site:

Action for Vendors

Vendors must retrieve the APL file each day, and download the most current version of the APL to their store's POS system.

Stores with Integrated POS Cash Register Systems should ask their corporate office, IT Department, or POS Equipment Provider to verify that they have the most current APL file.

Stores with WIC Stand-Beside POS terminals must leave their POS terminals powered-on overnight to receive the APL file automatically.

Vendors must ensure all necessary employees are immediately notified of this temporary expansion to the APL. To see the infant formula options added to the APL, please follow the links below:

Authority

Federal regulations (7 C.F.R. §246.2 "EBT Capable") require, that a WIC vendor system maintains the APL and matches scanned food items' UPC or PLU on the state's APL. The California WIC Vendor Agreement states in Article III 2.(g)(1), that the vendor's point of sale system must retrieve the APL on each day that Vendor processes WIC EBT transactions, excluding official holidays, Saturdays, and Sundays.
