The Antimicrobial Stewardship Subcommittee meeting was held on Wednesday June 8, 2016, via teleconference.

Dr. Lee called the meeting to order at 2:06 pm.

DISCUSSION:

Brian Lee, MD welcomed participants to the meeting, and invited all on the call to state their name and institution. New attendance included:

DISCUSSION:

Review of Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act

Members were reminded of the Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act 2010 rules. Specifically, to ensure all meeting agenda items are submitted within time to ensure they are included on the published agenda which must be posted 10 days prior of the actual meeting date. In addition, members are to ensure they are not discussing meeting information outside of public meetings with more than one additional member or member of the public to comply with the rules whether it is on the phone, via email or in person. Should members have additional comments or questions regarding meeting information after the meeting ends, they should contact the subcommittee chair directly to address their requests.

Update from CDPH/HAI –AC

Members were informed of the CDPH is partnering with California Association of Health Facilities (CAHF) and the Quality Care Health Foundation (QCHF) to support the CA skilled nursing providers preparing for the new mandate (SB 361) to offer a free 6-part webinar series:

Antibiotic Stewardship in Nursing Homes. Each interactive one-hour webinar will address a topic area that aligns with the CDC “Core Elements of Antibiotic Stewardship in Nursing Homes” and will feature different presenters and panelists from key stakeholder organizations across the state. The next webinar is 7/27/16.

Members reviewed the proposed letter that is to be sent out to health professional schools and residency training programs. It was mentioned for the health professional schools, the letter is to be sent to the Deans of the schools and for residency training schools, the letter is to be sent to residency/fellowship director or the chair of the graduate education committee. A recommendation was made to attempt to shorten the letter to one page to ensure readability. Members agreed the last sentence of the first paragraph could be potentially removed. Another recommendation was to bold the action item sentence in the last paragraph to draw their eyes to the action that needs to be taken. Members all agreed to present the letter with the proposed edits to CDPH at the next HAI-AC meeting in August.

Members reviewed the draft survey questions to determine additional questions to be added or to be edited accordingly. A recommendation was made to edit question #3, option C and D from General Physician and Pharmacist to Non-ID Trained Physician or Pharmacist. A recommendation was made to question #5 to add an option C unknown. It was recommended to add a line to question #7, option E to allow information to be written. Recommendations

were made to add an option C unknown to both questions #9 and #10. Members all agreed to present the survey with the proposed edits to CDPH at the next HAI-AC meeting in August.

The list of all the California Health Professional schools and Residency Training Programs for dental, medical, pharmacy, physician assistants, nurse practitioners and residency training programs was reviewed for completeness. Members all agreed to present the list to CDPH at the next HAI-AC meeting in August.

DISCUSSION:

Components of ASP for skilled nursing facilities: SB361: On or before 1/1/17, each skilled nursing facility, as defined in subdivision © of Section 1250, shall adopt and implement an antimicrobial stewardship policy that is consistent with antimicrobial stewardship guidelines developed by CDC and CMS, SHEA or similar recognized professional organizations

The tiered ASP components for SNFs were reviewed. Bullet #2 under the Basic Tier will be broken into 2 bullets. The new bullet #3 will be changed from hospital quality committee to the QAPI committee. Bullet #5 should spell out IDSA in its entirety since it is the first time it is mentioned in the document. A recommendation was made to add “about the purpose and goals of ASP at least annually” for Education of Staff to bullet #7. Bullet #8 is to be shortened by removing the wording “reported as days of therapy per 1000 days”. Bullet #9 is to be removed from the Basic tier entirely. At the beginning of bullet #10 “Prior to prescribing” is to be added to the sentence and “indication” is to be added at the end of the sentence. Bullet #11 is to add the word “implement” at the beginning of the sentence and update it to read “patient assessment tools to guide nursing in a comprehensive symptom based assessment according to the most updated McGreer criteria.
