Change parent designation to reflect gender identity for child (Effective January 1, 2023)	Informational Pamphlet: Affidavit to Amend a Birth Record Form: VS 24 Birth – Application to Amend a Birth Record	 A certified copy of the court-ordered change of gender, including a certified English translation, if applicable. The parent's new birth certificate reflecting a change of gender and sex identifier. A government-issued identity document reflecting the parent's change of gender and sex identifier. An affidavit attesting under penalty of perjury that the request for a change of the designation of the petitioner as mother, father, or parent is to conform to the person's gender identity and is not made for a fraudulent purpose. If child is over 18 years old, must include: A notarized letter from the adult child stipulating to the change to the adult child's birth certificate, "I, (adult child's full name), stipulate to an issuance of a new birth certificate for me that reflects my parent's legal gender and name."
Report adoptions to vital records offices	 Informational Pamphlet: <u>The Adoption Process</u> Form: <u>VS 44 – Court Report of Adoption</u> 	Certified copy of the Adoption Order or Final Decree Note: Notarized sworn statement is not required if court clerk submits form.
