Influenza Update – Week 46 (November 9 – November 15, 2008)

National Influenza Activity:

During week 46 (November 9-15, 2008), a low level of influenza activity was reported in the United States. Sixteen (0.9%) specimens tested by U.S. World Health Organization (WHO) and National Respiratory and Enteric Virus Surveillance System (NREVSS) collaborating laboratories, and reported to CDC/Influenza Division, were positive for influenza. The proportion of deaths attributed to pneumonia and influenza (P&I) was below the epidemic threshold. The proportion of outpatient visits for influenza-like illness (ILI) was below national and region-specific baseline levels. Twenty-one states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico reported sporadic influenza activity and 29 states reported no influenza activity. One human infection with a novel influenza A virus was reported.

California Influenza Activity:

Influenza activity, including sentinel provider outpatient influenza-like illnesses (ILI), Kaiser Permanente P&I (pneumonia and influenza) hospitalizations and influenza laboratory tests in both Northern and Southern California, remained sporadic (defined by the CDC as "Isolated cases of lab confirmed influenza in the state, but ILI activity is not increased").














Kaiser Pharmacy Data Influenza Antiviral Usage 2004-2009


Laboratory Data (viral isolation and detection)

[‡]Sentinel laboratories are hospital, academic, private, and public health laboratories located throughout California that provide data on the number of laboratory-confirmed influenza and other respiratory virus detections and isolations. The Respiratory Laboratory Network (RLN) is a network of 23 local public health laboratories that offer enhanced diagnostic testing with the "R-mix" shell vial assay, which detects several respiratory pathogens, including influenza A and B viruses, respiratory syncytial virus, parainfluenza virus, and adenovirus. Some RLN labs also offer PCR testing for influenza A and B.


