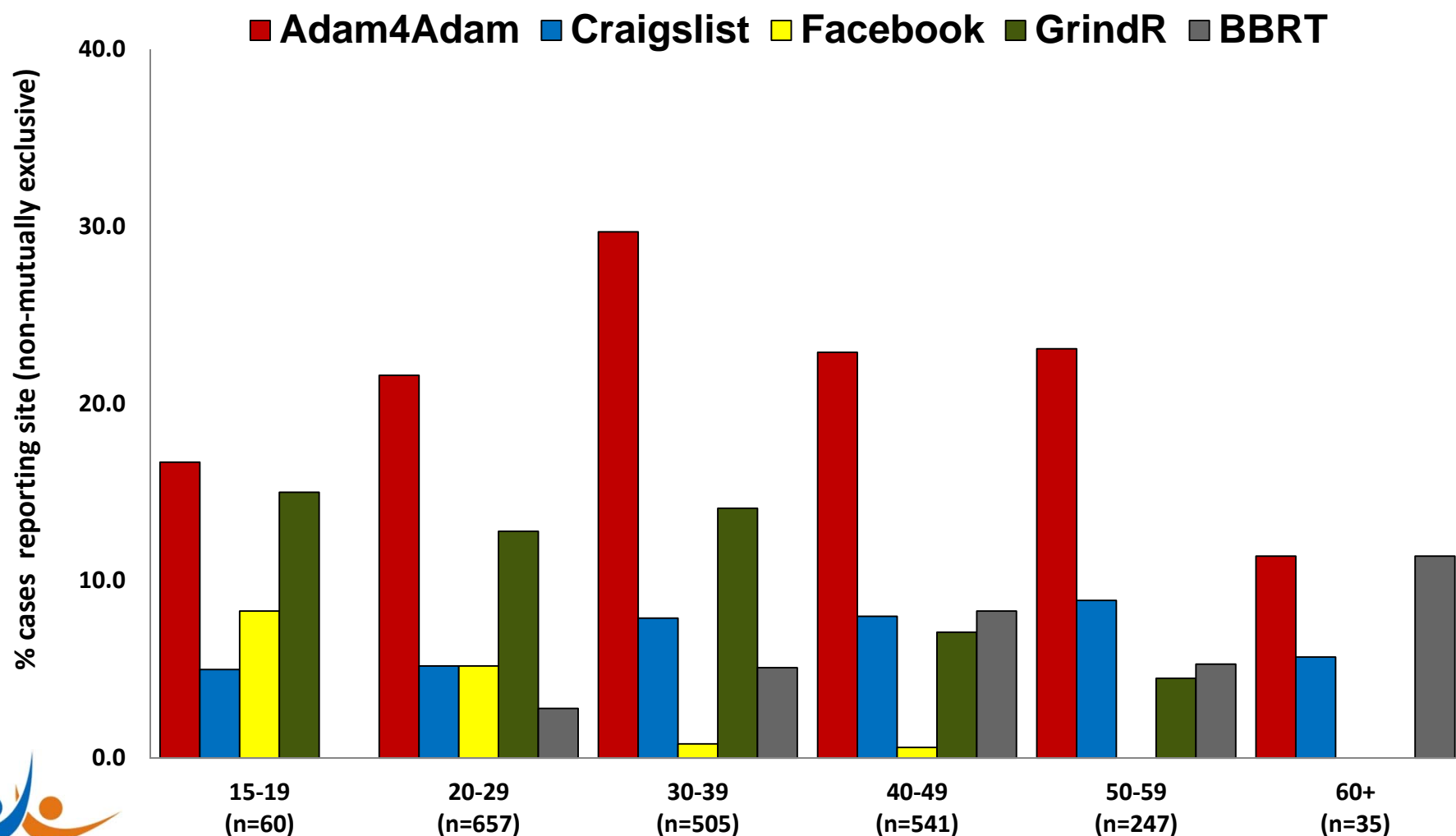

Technology	Who Does What?	Process
<p>Record Searching Client Information on the Internet</p>	<p>LHJ Staff</p>	<p>Use of Google, etc. (according to local protocols)</p>
<p>Accurint “People Finder” Record Searching</p>	<p>LHJ Staff (San Francisco, L.A.) Other CPA LHJS: Utilize a State Liaison</p>	<p>Send requests by completing and faxing "Person Search Request Form" to CDPH STD ICCR at (916) 440-5348.</p>
<p>Text Messaging</p>	<p>Local Health Jurisdiction Staff</p>	<p>Sending texts via work cell phone or other web-based texting modalities (according to local protocols)</p>

Standard Email (Gmail, Yahoo, AOL)	LHJ Staff	Use of local health department individual staff email accounts to initiate contact with clients (according to State, national, and local protocols)
Other Mobile Applications (Grindr, Jack'd, Scruff)	LHJ Staff	Use of Network Apps (according to local protocols)
Private Network Websites (Adam4Adam, BBRT, Manhunt)	State IPN Liaisons Select LHJ Staff	Creation of Public Health Accounts on private sites to initiate contact with clients (according to State, national, and local protocols)
