What does OHB do to make workplaces safer?

The Occupational Health Branch (OHB) is a non-regulatory program in the California Department of Public Health. OHB works to prevent injury and illness on the job. We:

- Identify and evaluate workplace hazards
- Track patterns of work-related injury and illness
- Work with others to develop safer ways to work
- Provide information, training and technical assistance to prevent workplace injury and illness
- Recommend more protective workplace standards



What can OHB do for you?

- **HELPLINES** OHB staff answer hundreds of calls a year about workplace hazards and how to prevent them.
- **EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS** OHB develops training and informational materials to help workers, employers and others prevent injury and illness on the job.
- **TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE** OHB's staff of health and safety professionals, doctors, toxicologists and health educators provide assistance on many health and safety topics.
- **JOINT PROJECTS** OHB teams up with business, labor, public health agencies and researchers to work cooperatively on projects to prevent workplace injury and illness.
